Cancer Institute Partners on Tobacco Compliance Checks

he Northeast Regional Cancer Institute, in conjunction with the Partnership for a Tobacco Free Northeast PA and the Lackawanna County District Attorney's office is conducting tobacco compliance checks throughout Lackawanna County.

A compliance check is an unannounced attempt to purchase tobacco by youth in an effort to monitor sales of tobacco products to persons under the age of 18. In Pennsylvania, state law prohibits the sale of tobacco to minors. Retailers who

sell tobacco to youth will be held accountable for that sale through the tobacco compliance check program. Tobacco compliance checks will take place periodically throughout the year.

According to Campaign for Tobacco Free Kids, 21.5 million packs of cigarettes are bought or smoked by youth (under 18) each year.

"We have performed tobacco compliance checks on several hundred licensed tobacco retailers," said Andrew Jarbola, Lackawanna County District Attorney. "Just over 30 retailers were cited for illegal sale of tobacco to minors."

Underage youth who volunteer to participate in this program are trained and are supervised by adults during the tobacco purchase attempt. "Many

students who volunteer for this opportunity want to help keep their community safe," said Jane Oswald, Tobacco Outreach Coordinator at the Northeast Regional Cancer Institute. "Other students decide to use this experience for service credits toward scout requirements or senior projects."

The Northeast Regional Cancer Institute, in conjunction with The Partnership for a Tobacco Free Northeast Pennsylvania, provides tobacco prevention, cessation, compliance, and outreach services throughout Lackawanna County in partnership with local social service and healthcare professionals, policymakers, school districts, law enforcement professionals, businesses, and residents.

Free Skin Cancer Screenings Made Available to Uninsured Residents of Lackawanna County

ccording to the National Cancer Institute, skin cancer is the most common form of cancer in the United States. More than 1 million skin cancer cases are diagnosed annually.

The Northeast Regional Cancer Institute, Scranton Temple Residency Program (STRP) and The Blue Ribbon Foundation of Blue Cross of Northeastern Pennsylvania partnered to offer the Skin Cancer Screening Access Program.

The Skin Cancer Screening Access Program was a campaign to educate uninsured residents of Lackawanna County about risk factors, sun protection, early signs of skin cancer, strategies for self-examination, and the need for examination by a clinician experienced in diagnosing skin cancer. Five free skin cancer screenings were conducted as well as education and outreach programs for nearly 300 adult participants.

Through collaboration with STRP, free screenings were available for uninsured residents of Lackawanna County between April 15th and June 23rd in Scranton.

Funding for the Skin Cancer Screening Access Program was provided by The Blue Ribbon Foundation of Blue Cross of Northeastern Pennsylvania, STRP, and the Cancer Institute.

Limited free skin cancer screening will take place between April 15th and May 30th in Scranton.

During the five free screening events, biopsies of 69 suspicious lesions were collected. Five cancers were detected and 11 lesions were identified as high risk, or lesions that are not cancerous but have a high risk for tansforming into cancer in the future. Follow up care for the cancerous and high risk lesions were performed at STRP.

"We are very pleased that we had an opportunity to partner with these organizations and provide free skin cancer screenings to individuals who have benefited from this care," said Samuel M. Lesko, MD, MPH, Director of Research and Medical Director at the Northeast Regional Cancer Institute.


