All participants are encouraged to visit the Cancer Institute tent to sign the "Survivors Banner," receive a survivor or caregiver pin, and pick up other information. The game starts at 7:05 p.m. and seating in the stadium begins at 6 p.m.

Another new feature of the event this year will be the addition of a "Virtual Display Booth" online information gallery. This website will feature information on local cancer resources provided by area organizations and will take the place of the staffed resource booths that were set up at the event in past years. Jill Evans Kryston - Story of Survivorship

It's an honor to co-chair this year's Cancer Survivors Celebration. My connection to cancer began in August, 2005. While attending my cousin's funeral it dawned on me that something serious may be wrong. My cousin died of ovarian cancer, but was first treated for irritable bowel syndrome. Coincidently, I had begun to experience irritable bowel symptoms during that summer.

I wasted no time in scheduling an overdue doctor appointment and was quickly diagnosed with the "silent disease" of ovarian cancer at age 51. After a radical hysterectomy I began a course of chemotherapy which ended in a full remission.

Cancer runs deep through my family and to date, I'm the only member who's survived. At age 13, I watched my 38 year old mother suffer and die from breast and abdominal cancer which we now believe was ovarian. Moreover, she lost her young mother through a similar scenario. Subsequently, other family members died before their time of familial cancers. It was no wonder that I was the perfect candidate for genetic testing.

The decision to pursue genetic counseling and testing was prompted by the helpless feeling of watching many family members perish from this horrific disease. A mother of three, my thoughts centered on the idea that, for the first time, our family would have choices and opportunities for prevention never before available to them. The

genetic test showed I have a hereditary mutation known as BRCA 2. Although this places me at an increased risk for breast cancer, hormone therapies are available for

protection as well as breast MRIs for surveillance.

The story doesn't end just yet. In 2009 I experienced a recurrence which was successfully retreated.

As a two-time survivor, I encourage a positive outlook and offer hope to all those running this race. Additionally, I salute the Northeast Regional Cancer Institute for their continual support and dedication to the cancer community in Lackawanna and Luzerne Counties. They not only stand with us, but they see us through our journey. Many thanks and gratitude for their help!
