A former marketing manager at Northeastern Pennsylvania Imaging Center, Ms. Moran Saunders formerly served on the Cancer Institute's Board of Directors and has volunteered at institute fundraisers. She also serves on the Board of Directors of the American Association of Healthcare Administrative Manager's NEPA Chapter.

Following Mr. Durkin's resignation, the Cancer Institute's executive committee, comprised of both former and current Board members, along with a search firm, worked to identify the most-qualified candidate to serve as the new leader of the Cancer Institute.

Mr. Peter Danchak, Chairman of the Cancer Institute's Board of Directors, says Ms. Moran Saunders was the ideal candidate. "She brings much strength to the position, including her experience in the health care industry and her years of involvement with the Cancer Institute as a volunteer and advocate in which she demonstrated her dedication to its mission of easing the burden of cancer in northeast Pennsylvania."

More than 5,300 C.A.S.U.A.L. Day awareness t-shirts and 3,000 pins were sold this year as part of the annual colon cancer awareness campaign. Nearly 800 more t-shirts were sold this year than in 2013, marking an all-time high in t-shirt sales! With your help, the Cancer Institute raised \$127,000 to support local colorectal cancer education and outreach services. More importantly, approximate-

ly 8,000 individuals took part in the event and raised awareness about life saving screening guidelines and risk factors for this disease.
