This tournament is open to any co-ed team of 6 players or more. There will be 3 Divisions: Competitive, Recreation, and Beginner.

The format will consist of round robin play. This will conclude play in the Beginner Division. The other will have the top teams in each pool advancing to their playoffs

Beginner Division is for teams with inexperienced players or players new to the game.

Recreation Division is set up for the occasional or Recreation League players. This is our largest division and is played on the outdoor courts. At the

The Competitive Division will consist of players with Varsity level experience at the High School and College level. Play in this division is expected to be of a higher caliber.

Cost per team is \$85 before 5/11/14 and \$100 afterwards.

Key Information!

The tournament is open to any team however space is limited. Entry will be accepted up until May 21, 2014. After that entry will be accepted, provided openings exist, on the day of the tournament. Only pre-registered teams are guaranteed shirts, others are 1st come 1st served.

Play will be Co-ed 6. Teams must have at least 2 females on the court at all times. Teams may have more female players on the court if they desire.

All team captains must be present at Dunmore High School prior to 8:30 AM the morning of play. Teams will receive their shirts at registration. Upon completion of registration there will be a brief rules meeting, at which time all captains will be given court assignments as well as one team schedule.

Play will commence promptly at 9:00 AM. The next match will ensue upon the completion of the game prior. Matches generally last approximately 45 minutes. It is the captain's responsibility to get their players to the proper court on time and insure they are adequately warmed up.

During round robin play, one of the idle teams will be assigned to referee. The assignment will rotate. The assigned team is expected to provide one person to serve as referee.

Directions to Dunmore High School

Dunmore High School is accessible from Interstate 81. Take the Drinker St. Exit, Exit 186 or Throop Dunmore Exit, Exit 188.

From Exit 186, take a left on Drinker St. Go approximately 1.5 miles to 3rd traffic light at Quincy Ave. Make a right and Dunmore High School is straight ahead.

From Exit 188, follow sign for Dunmore. At the traffic light at the end of the cemetery, take a right. The high School is about .4 mile down Warren St.
