In addition to all the exciting offerings at the event, each year, the Ambassadors select a Tribute to Courage Honoree. They will recognize Dr. Christopher A. Peters. Dr. Christopher A. Peters is a partner in Radiation Medicine Associates of Scranton (RAMAS). He is medical director of Northeast Radiation Oncology Centers (NROC) as well as its director of clinical research.

In 2012, Dr. Peters joined the Board of Directors of the Northeast Regional Cancer Institute (NRCI) and served as Board Chairman in 2017 and 2108. He is an Associate Professor of Medicine at Geisinger Commonwealth School of Medicine and Director of its 4th year elective in Radiation Oncology. He was elected President of the Lackawanna County Medical Society in 2016.Dr. Peters is a graduate of the University of Pennsylvania and received his Doctor of Medicine degree from Case Western Reserve University, Cleveland, where he was elected to the Alpha Omega Alpha national medical honor society. After completing an

internship in Internal Medicine at Case Western Reserve Metrohealth, he performed his Radiation Oncology residency at Mount Sinai Hospital, New York City, serving as Chief Resident in his final year.

Dr. Peters was an intern at the Northeast Regional Cancer Institute years before he joined our board. He has a steadfast relationship with NRCI.
